

#### Youth News



#### Parish Nurse News

Did you know that how much and how well you sleep are vital indicators of your overall health and well-being? And did you know that we spend up to one-third of our lives asleep?

April 23<sup>rd</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> is National Sleep Awareness Week. This awareness campaign is aimed at helping people realize the importance of getting good sleep and making sleep a priority to improve our health.

We all know that getting a good night's sleep is important. But how many of us make it a priority? Chronic lack of sleep is termed "sleep debt". According to the National Sleep Foundation, the effects of insufficient sleep (health care expenses and lost productivity) equate to an annual cost in the U.S. of about \$66 billion? And just like a credit card, sleep debt eventually has to be repaid.

Americans tend to have some of the poorest sleep habits worldwide. Work / life imbalances, stress, and lack of exercise are major contributors. Other factors include stimulants like coffee and energy drinks, alarm clocks, and external lights (mainly from electronics) which interfere with our natural sleep / wake cycles.

How does chronic lack of sleep effect you? When you're awake, adenosine (a natural body chemical) builds up in your blood. When you are asleep, your body breaks it down. If you are sleep deprived, the chemical continues to build. Higher levels of adenosine slow your reaction times and decrease your concentration making you more prone to accidents and mistakes. A shortage of sleep is to blame for approximately 100,000 traffic accidents, 76,000 injuries, and 1500 deaths each year nationwide. Getting just two or three hours too little sleep for a few nights in a row can have the same sleep debt effect as being up all night. However, it's something Americans do routinely.

To help set the stage for better sleep, here are some tips to help make the time you do sleep be quality time:

Stick to a sleep schedule, even on the weekends

Practice a relaxing bedtime ritual such as meditation or a bath

Exercise daily

Evaluate your bedroom to ensure ideal temperature, sound and light.

Sleep on a comfortable mattress and pillows

Watch out for "sleep stealers" like alcohol and caffeine several hours before bedtime

Turn off electronics before bed - read a good book (or The Good Book!) instead

Make sleep a priority. Put it on your to-do list but don't make it the thing you do after everything else is done!

If you or a family member is experiencing symptoms such as excessive sleepiness during the day, snoring, leg cramps or tingling, difficulty breathing during sleep, or prolonged insomnia, please see your health care provider for an assessment of underlying health conditions that might be disrupting your sleep.
